Dear Citrus County Charitable Foundation board members,

On behalf of Citrus Abuse Shelter, CASA, I am submitting this letter in a dire request for additional funding to continue the mental health provider services through the end of May 2026. This is in addition to the 2025-2026 funding cycle approved award of \$30,000. After the estimated cost of the program for the year was communicated in the grant application, the provider increased their cost significantly October 1, 2025, causing the budget to be at a large shortfall. We are requesting an additional \$30,800. To date, the remaining funding will support services provided through January. With an average cost of services being \$7,700 a month, serving 48 individuals, the requested amount would ensure that these cherished and critical services would not have to be discontinued.

We recognize this is a significant request of the foundation. Unfortunately, due to recent federal funding reductions, a \$290,000 decrease in VOCA funding, this has placed even basic shelter operational costs at risk for CASA. The goal long term is still to assume funding responsibility for the mental health services as the agency did several years ago however the communication that has been made is that is not to be expected until 2028 now.

Your investment in this project has impacted 72 individuals within the community in an incredibly powerful way, and we want to extend our sincerest appreciation.

I am writing to solicit your input regarding the Office of the Attorney General's (OAG) 2025-2026 Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) grant awards. As you know from previous correspondence, Florida's VOCA allocation has decreased annually for several years and will continue to decrease for several more years. This office has fought to maintain funding levels for the last several years, but funding will decrease this year.


The OAG will distribute the 2022 VOCA allocation of \$91,878,955 in the 2025-2026 fiscal year. Over the next several years, the OAG will distribute Florida's 2023 and 2024 awards of \$87,867,754 and \$50,740,661, respectively. The Department of Justice has not awarded the 2025 grant yet, but the OAG anticipates receiving \$84,904,557. With your input, the OAG hopes to maximize the amount of funds that will be available to maintain services during the 2027-2028 fiscal year, when we anticipate distributing the 2024 award, which is 42% less than the 2023 award.

The last time grant awards were decreased, from the 2022-2023 fiscal year to the 2023-2024 fiscal year, the OAG's calculation included a review of projected spending by subgrantees. This year, we are considering several options to determine the most efficient use of these valuable funds. This includes, but is not limited to, reviewing projected spending and spending history (has the subgrantee utilized its entire award in previous years), as well as the size of the award, which would apply to smaller grants (is a subgrantee's award an amount where any cut would make the grant unusable).

We know every VOCA dollar is valuable and necessary, which is why we welcome your input on the process. And we think it prudent to make adequate plans to accommodate expected decreases in the future. 



Ms. Barton:

Jessie's Place is hereby requesting consideration for funding in the current emergency grant cycle. Since the 2022-2023 fiscal year, Jessie's Place has realized a 65% reduction in our federal funding. Our total loss over the last four years equates to more than \$567,032.00. This fiscal year, our federal funding was reduced by \$3,853.00

Our state funding is all managed and distributed by the Florida Network of Child Advocacy Centers, but it is allocated from different "funding pots." One pot is recurring general revenue (identified as GR funding) which has been reduced by \$33,956.00 since 2022-2023 fiscal year. The other pot is non-recurring appropriations (identified as BTG funding) which have been reduced by \$46,907.00 or more than 23.5% over the last fiscal year. For the 2025-2026 fiscal year, we have realized a net loss in state funding of \$43,799.00.

This year, our state and federal funding was reduced by \$47,652.00. Over the past four years we have managed state and federal funding reductions of more than \$419,655.00.

We truly appreciate the Foundation's commitment to our community and recognizing the needs of your grantees. Any contribution Jessie's Place receives from the Foundation will be used to cover unfunded personnel costs.




2. The criminal history records check must be completed in accordance with §394.4572, 408.809, and 435.12 Florida Statutes. A letter certifying that no disqualifying crimes were identified must be submitted to the Network Contract Manager within 30 days. If the Provider adds additional employees during the term of this Subcontract, the names of those staff, employees, or subcontractor staff must be provided to the Network Contract Manager within 7 days of beginning work. The Provider shall resubmit updated criminal history records checks certification letters every five (5) years from the prior criminal history records check if the Subcontract is in force.
3. If any disqualifying crimes are present on the record, the Provider agrees to remove the employee from the worksite and terminate the employee's access to confidential information resources, participants, and the participant's family members.
4. During the term of the Subcontract, the Provider shall report in writing to the Network Contract Manager, the arrest, charge, or Notice to Appear for an alleged commission of a disqualifying crime in any state or other jurisdiction for any Provider's staff, employee, or subcontractor assigned to this Subcontract within one (1) business day of Provider's knowledge. The notice shall include the Provider's name, the staff member's name, and the location and nature of the alleged violation. The Network reserves the right to require the Provider to immediately suspend or terminate the staff members work under this Subcontract, access to any children and their families' receiving services funded by this Subcontract and state or federal confidential information obtained or maintained under this Subcontract. The Provider shall notify the Network within ten (10) calendar days of case disposition.

T. Confidentiality Breach Reporting and Notification Responsibility

That the Provider is subject to the provisions of 501.171 Florida Statutes, that requires the reporting and remedies for breach of security related to third-party confidentiality information, as well as fines of up to \$500,000 for failure to report timely.

U. Text Messaging While Driving by Subcontractors, Award Recipients, and Subrecipients

FUNDRAISING COMMITTEE POLICIES AND PROCEDURES MANUAL
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SECTION 1.00 PURPOSE AND SCOPE

The Fundraising Committee (“Committee”) of Citrus County Community Charitable Foundation, Inc. (“Foundation”) is established to oversee all fundraising activities, ensuring they are conducted ethically, legally, and in accordance with the mission of the Foundation. The Committee’s responsibilities include developing and implementing fundraising policies, monitoring compliance, ensuring proper stewardship of donor funds, and maintaining the integrity of donor relations.

This manual sets forth the policies and procedures governing the Committee’s operations, including ethical standards, financial oversight, donor relations, and compliance with applicable federal, state, and local laws.

SECTION 2.00 COMMITTEE OPERATIONS

2.01 Authority and Responsibilities

The Committee reports to the Board of Directors and makes recommendations regarding fundraising strategies, campaigns, and policies. Responsibilities include recommending fundraising policies and procedures for Board approval; evaluating fundraising activities and ensuring compliance with donor intent and applicable laws; and reporting regularly to the Board on fundraising performance and donor stewardship.

2.02 Membership and Meetings

Members are appointed and removed in accordance with the Foundation’s Bylaws. The Committee shall meet as needed, but no less than twice per year. A majority of members constitutes a quorum. Minutes of meetings shall be maintained and filed with the corporate records.

2.03 Volunteer Fundraising Policy

Volunteers engaged in fundraising shall act in accordance with all Committee policies and ethical standards. Volunteers shall receive appropriate training regarding solicitation practices, donor confidentiality, and legal compliance. Volunteers shall not receive compensation.

2.04 Partnership and Third-Party Fundraising Policy

All third-party fundraising activities conducted on behalf of the Foundation must receive prior written approval from the Committee. The Foundation shall ensure that third-party fundraisers comply with all legal requirements and maintain appropriate oversight. Agreements with third parties shall clearly define the use of funds, reporting requirements, and branding or naming rights.

SECTION 3.00 ETHICAL STANDARDS AND COMPLIANCE

3.01 Ethical Fundraising Policy

The Committee and all fundraisers shall adhere to the ethical standards set forth by the Association of Fundraising Professionals (AFP) Code of Ethics. Fundraisers shall not solicit or accept gifts in exchange for personal gain, nor shall any individual be compensated, including compensation based on percentage of funds raised.

3.02 Conflict of Interest Policy

Committee members and fundraisers must disclose any personal or financial interest that may conflict with the Foundation's fundraising activities. Disclosed conflicts shall be evaluated by the Committee, and affected members shall recuse themselves from related decisions.

3.03 Regulatory Compliance

All fundraising activities shall comply with federal and state charitable solicitation laws. Written acknowledgment must follow IRS requirements.

3.04 Donor and Record Security Policy

Donor and fundraising records shall be retained in accordance with the Foundation's Records Retention and Privacy Policies. Digital and paper records shall be secured against unauthorized access, loss, or destruction. Disposal of records shall be conducted in a secure manner to protect donor confidentiality.

SECTION 4.00 FUNDRAISING AND DONOR POLICIES

4.01 Gift Solicitation and Acceptance Policy

The Foundation may accept gifts of cash, securities, real property, in-kind contributions, or planned gifts, provided such gifts are consistent with the Foundation's mission and values. Gifts that are restricted, unusual, or potentially burdensome shall require Committee review and approval prior to acceptance. The Committee reserves the right to decline any gift that may create financial or reputational risk to the Foundation.

4.02 Gift Acknowledgment Policy

The Foundation shall provide written acknowledgment of all contributions within 45 days of receipt. Acknowledgments shall comply with IRS substantiation requirements and include information on tax deductibility where applicable.

4.03 Donor Recognition Policy

Donor shall be recognized fairly and consistently in accordance with the Foundation's established recognition levels. Naming opportunities and public acknowledgment shall follow Committee approval procedures and documented agreements.

4.04 Donor Privacy and Confidentiality Policy

Donor information shall be maintained in strict confidence and used solely for purposes consistent with the Foundation's mission. The Foundation shall comply with all applicable public records laws and provide donors with the opportunity to opt-out of public disclosure where legally permissible.

4.05 Donor Bill of Rights

The Foundation affirms the following rights for all donors:

- To be informed of the Foundation's mission, purpose, and the use of donated funds.
- To receive accurate and timely acknowledgment of contributions.
- To have personal information kept confidential.
- To expect ethical solicitation and stewardship of funds.

4.06 Fundraising and Special Events Policy

All fundraising events shall be planned and executed with prior Committee approval, including budget, fundraising goals, and legal compliance. Special events, raffles, and auctions shall comply with state and local laws governing charitable activities.

4.07 Sponsorship Policy

Corporate or individual sponsorships shall align with the Foundation's mission and values. Sponsorship agreements shall be reviewed and approved by the Committee, including recognition rights, branding, and any exclusivity arrangements.

4.08 Campaign Planning Policy

All campaigns, including capital campaigns and annual giving drives, shall be planned with written objectives, feasibility studies, and Board approval. Campaign performance shall be monitored with periodic reporting to the Committee and Board.

SECTION 5.00 FINANCIAL OVERSIGHT AND STEWARDSHIP

5.01 Gift Processing Policy

All contributions shall be promptly recorded and deposited according to internal financial control procedures. Only authorized personnel shall handle cash or negotiate instruments.

5.02 Restricted Funds Policy

Restricted gifts shall be used solely for the purpose designated by the donor with oversight by the Board and Committee to ensure compliance with donor intent and proper accounting for all restricted contributions.

5.03 Endowment and Planned Giving Policy

Planned gifts, bequests, and endowment contributions shall be solicited, accepted, and administered in accordance with legal and ethical standards. Investment and disbursement policies for endowment funds shall be approved by the Board.

5.04 Donor Concerns and Resolution Policy

Donor inquiries or complaints regarding fundraising activities or the use of funds shall be documented and referred to the Committee Chair or Executive Director for timely resolution.

SECTION 6.00 REVIEW AND AMENDMENTS

These policies shall be reviewed by the Committee annually. Amendments may be proposed by the Committee and require approval by the Board of Directors. Updated policies shall be documented, distributed to Committee members and relevant staff, and maintained in the Foundation's official records.
